The Organization

Temple Beth El's mission is to be an embracing, supportive and vibrant community which observes Conservative Judaism and is committed to perpetuating Jewish values, culture, and tradition. Temple Beth El honors the diversity of its members and is committed to their spiritual, intellectual, and religious growth.

Located in Portland, Maine and founded in 1947, Temple Beth EI (TBE) is a major regional center of Conservative Judaism north of Boston and the largest Conservative Jewish congregation in Maine with a membership of approximately 300 families. TBE encompasses the synagogue, a religious school (Kadima Beth El or KBE), a community cemetery, and relationships with various partners and building tenants including the Levey Day School and the Orthodox congregation Shaarey Tphiloh. The synagogue owns and operates within a 21,000 square foot building built in 1948 and extensively updated in recent years. It is staffed by approximately 7 FTEs that includes a full-time Rabbi, Executive Director (ED), an Events/Operations Manager, an Office and Communications Manager, and part-time educators, custodial staff, and others, plus an outsourced bookkeeping service that handles day-to-day financial operations and reporting. The dedicated secular staff provides outstanding day-to-day operational support for the ED.

TBE has an active Board and Executive Committee which partner closely and collaboratively with the ED to provide strategic, financial, programmatic and administrative oversight of the synagogue. TBE has long been known as a pioneering institution on issues ranging from social action to the equal participation of women.

The Portland, Maine Community

Portland is the economic, cultural, and educational center of Maine. Portland holds the #7 spot in the US News & World Report's "Best City to Live" rankings, a testament to its exceptional quality of life. Imagine a picturesque coastline framing an active waterfront, accentuated by historic architecture—with eagles and osprey gliding above the islands offshore. In between, Portland is home to some of the best recommended restaurants in the country, and full of shops run by proprietors who will tell you they are working their dream job. The people are friendly and welcoming. On top of it all, Portland proudly welcomes and integrates hundreds of refugees here every year to the community.

It's also an exceptional place for young as well as mature families. Living so close to nature, the changing seasons provide a myriad of experiences that make childhood and adulthood magical, like picking ripe blueberries while walking in the woods, tasting wildflower honey, camping under golden leaves, skating on frozen ponds, enjoying miles of pristine ocean beaches and boiling maple syrup. Portland is accessible to watersports, hiking, camping, and skiing throughout Maine. We are located only a few hours from Acadia National Park.

Beyond its physical beauty, Maine has a strong social fabric and civic pride, as well as a vibrant cultural scene. We are lucky to have multiple theater companies; a beautiful auditorium that hosts dance, classical music, and touring Broadway companies; and a world-class art museum. We have three (soon to be four) minor league sports teams. Tickets to all are available and affordable. Portland is well-known nationally as a foodie destination, with a vibrant restaurant and food truck scene, as well as craft breweries and distilleries.

Adding to those aspects that have always been true, Portland is now experiencing transformative growth. Northeastern University's Roux Institute opened in the past 3 years, creating a data science and entrepreneurship-focused graduate school and startup hub. The Portland area is host to multiple institutes of higher education, including the University of Southern Maine-Portland campus; the University of New England Medical and Dental schools; Maine College of Art and Design; the University of Maine Law School; and Southern Maine Community College. Maine's natural beauty and resources attract professionals in the fields of climate, sustainability and ocean technology, fueling new research and innovation. Our recent surge in population growth underscores Maine's magnetic appeal. Since the pandemic, Maine ranks seventh in in-migration rates nationally and is the fastest growing state in New England.
